Mr. Johnson, of Anne Arundel, moved to amend said amendment, as offered by Mr. Calvert, by adding at the end thereof the following proviso :

“Provided, That in no event shall the sums which the Legislature may hereafter appropriate to the purpose of making the extension contemplated by this section, interfere with or effect in any manner the application of the necessary amount of the revenues of the canal to the payment of the interest upon, or the sum to be set apart to extinguish the principal of the bonds authorised to be issued to complete the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal to Cumberland.”
