

And the memorial of sundry citizens of Carroll county, praying for a lottery to aid in completing a road from Westminster to Emmitsburg;

Which were severally twice read and concurred in.

On motion of Mr. Hughes,

The House took up for consideration the bill from the Senate, entitled, an act to authorize the commissioners of Charles county to cause the bridge across Allen's Fresh run in said county, to be repaired or rebuilt;

The said bill was then read the second time, passed, and returned to the Senate.

Mr. Biser from the select committee, reported a bill entitled, an act to make valid the official acts of John B. Gilbert, as a justice of the peace for Frederick county;

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Ford, of St. Mary's,

The House took up for consideration the bill entitled, an act to make valid a deed from N. Furck, wife and others to Anne A. Carpenter of St. Mary's county;

Which was read a second time by special order, passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Randall, from the select committee, reported a bill entitled, an act for the division of Baltimore county and city, and for erecting a new one by the name of Towson county, and to change the Constitution of this State so far as may be necessary to effect the same;

Mr. Calvert, chairman of the committee on Lotteries, made a favorable report upon the bill entitled, a supplement to an act passed December session 1839, chapter 316, to raise a sum of money to construct a turnpike road from Rockville in Montgomery county to the Monococy bridge;

Mr. Hollyday, of Cecil, from the select committee, reported a bill entitled, an act to provide for the admission of the statutes of the several States as evidence in the courts of this State, and

Mr. Long, chairman of the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, reported a bill entitled, an act to alter and change all such parts of the Constitution and form of government as relates to the appointment of a Treasurer for the Western Shore of this State;

Which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Ghiselin, chairman of the committee on Colored Population, reported a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Moses Lake and his wife Effene;

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time;
