

TUESDAY, January 21st, 1845.

The House met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

On motion of Mr. Johnson, of Anne Arundel,

Ordered, That the petition of the Farmers and Millers Bank of Hagerstown, praying that an act be passed directing the scire facias against said bank to be discontinued upon certain conditions therein mentioned, be withdrawn from the files of the House, and the same be referred to the committee on Ways and Means.

Mr. Shriver presented the memorial of the Farmers and Mechanics Band of Middletown Valley, praying for an act of incorporation;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Corporations.

Mr. Maffitt presented the petition of sundry citizens of Cecil county, praying that Mary and Elizabeth Burk, may be placed on the pension roll of said county;

Which was read and referred to the Cecil county delegation.

Mr. Johnson, of Frederick, presented the memorial of sundry citizens of Frederick county, praying the General Assembly, to appropriate the west wing of the Barracks of Frederick, for a Military school;

Which was read and referred to the Frederick county delegation.

Mr. Ford, of Saint Mary's, presented the petition of James Keech, praying the passage of an act to enable him to sell certain orphans property therein named;

Which was read and referred to the Saint Mary's county delegation.

Mr. Calvert presented the memorial of sundry citizens of Prince George's county, praying a division of the county into two surveyor's districts;

Which was read and referred to the Prince George's county delegation.

Mr. Clarke presented the petition of William Frenner, of Washington county, praying that a forfeited recognizance be paid to him;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Ways and Means.

Mr. Boteler presented the petition of fifty-six citizens of Washington county, praying an act to prohibit the sale of ardent spirits on the Sabbath, and for other purposes;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Ways and Means.

Mr. Fookes submitted the following order:

Ordered, That the President of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company, communicate to this House, the amount of the bonds
