An Act to repeal and re-enact Section 564-2 of Article 23 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Wicomico County (1965 Edition, being Article 23 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland), titled "Lower Shore Sheltered Workshop, Inc.", authorizing an increase in the appropriation to the Lower Shore Sheltered Workshop, Inc.

*Section 1.* BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF WICOMICO COUNTY, MARYLAND, That Section 564-2 of Article 23 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Wicomico County (1965 Edition, being Article 23 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland), title "Appropriation— Lower Shore Sheltered Workshop, Inc.", by and it is hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

**Section 564-2 Appropriation—Lower Shore Sheltered Workshop, Inc.**

The County Council of Wicomico County is hereby authorized and directed to levy a sum of [Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00)] TWELVE THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$12,500.00) and appropriate the same to the Lower Shore Sheltered Workshop, Inc., a non-profit corporation of the State of Maryland, to be used by said corporation in furtherance of its objectives.

*Section 2.* AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act, having been passed by the County Council at its Legislative Session of June, 1969, shall take effect August 1, 1969, unless a proper petition for referendum thereof shall be validly filed prior to said date, in which event this Act shall not take effect until the expiration of thirty (30) days following approval of this Act by a majority of the qualified voters of the County voting in any such referendum.
