Northside of Patuxent River being Part of Hunting Ridge Begin-
ning at about Red Oak of James Murreys Land bounded with
standing on a level and running North West one hundred fifty one
f Ches, to abounded Hicory then North East Two hundred fches
to abound Elm then South East one hundred fifty one fches, to Murreys
Line then South West with Murreys line to the first bound Tree
containing One hundred Eighty Eight Acres of Land more or less
with the appurtenances To Have and to Hold the said Tract
