

Kind of Game	Open Season
Male deer with two or more points to one antler, provided male deer with an antler three or more inches long, with the points measuring from the top of the skull as the deer is in life.	May be hunted for a period to be fixed annually by the Commission.
Antlerless deer	The Commission may prescribe an open season for antlerless deer, by special permit when deemed advisable, at such times and in such counties as the Commission shall in its discretion prescribe by regulation.
Deer, both sexes (bow and arrow)	In counties having a bow and arrow season, deer of either sex may be hunted for a period to be fixed annually by the Commission.

In any county or election district or other identifiable areas of the State, the Commission may reduce the wildlife population after a thorough investigation reveals that protected wildlife is seriously injurious to agricultural or other interests in the affected area. The method of reducing the wildlife population shall be at the discretion of the Commission except that wherever feasible trapping shall be preferred. The wildlife which may be taken under this provision shall be disposed of by the Director of the Department as he may deem advisable and for the best interests of the State.

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted*, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1972.

CHAPTER 325
(House Bill 1091)

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 124 of Article 27 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1971 Replacement Volume), title "Crimes and Punishments," subtitle "Crimes and Punishments," subheading "Drunkenness and Disorderly Conduct," to provide that Section 124 of Article 27 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (Disorderly conduct on land of another) shall apply to Somerset County.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That Section 124 of Article 27 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1971 Replacement Volume), title "Crimes and Punishments," subtitle "Crimes and Punishments," subheading "Drunkenness and Disorderly Conduct," be and it is hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, and to read as follows,
