

because the term "mammal" is being used to refer to any wild animal in this and subsequent sections. The phrase "or any part, egg, offspring, or dead body of any of them" is added to help enforcement of wildlife laws. Similar language is used in Article 66C, section 125(a)(1), which was enacted by Chapter 430, Acts of 1971. The only other changes made are in style.

[[(G)]] (H) "GAME BIRDS OR MAMMALS" MEANS THE SPECIES DEFINED AS FOREST GAME BIRDS AND MAMMALS, FUR-BEARING MAMMALS, UPLAND GAME BIRDS AND MAMMALS, AND WETLAND GAME BIRDS OR ANY PART, EGG, OFFSPRING, OR DEAD BODY OF ANY OF THEM.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This subsection is new language suggested by the department. It is designed to include those species encompassed within the present definition of "game and fur-bearing animals".

[[(H)]] (I) "GREEN PELT" MEANS A PELT WHICH IS NOT DRIED, CURED, OR TANNED.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This subsection presently appears as Article 66C, section 112(1) of the Code. New language is added to conform this definition with section 10-101(e). The present term "green pelt" is retained although a pelt does not have to be green colored. The only other changes made are in style.

[[(I)]] (J) "HUNT" MEANS TO PURSUE, CAPTURE, CATCH, KILL, GIG, TRAP, SHOOT, OR ATTEMPT TO PURSUE, CAPTURE, CATCH, KILL, GIG, TRAP, OR SHOOT, OR IN ANY MANNER REDUCE ANY BIRD OR MAMMAL TO PERSONAL POSSESSION.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This subsection presently appears as Article 66C, section 112(p) of the Code. New language derived from the proposed definition of "catch" in Title 4 is added to encompass any taking of birds or mammals. "Gig" is added to the definition of hunt to include the act prohibited by Article 66C, section 175(c) of the Code. The only other changes made are in style.

[[(J)]] (K) "MIGRATORY BIRDS" MEANS THOSE BIRDS
