

(C) AN OFFER OF COMPROMISE SHALL NOT EXCEED \$2,000 IN THE CASE OF RETAIL LICENSEES, AND SHALL NOT EXCEED [[\$25,000]] \$50,000 FOR OTHER LICENSEES AND PERMITTEES.

(D) THE COMPTROLLER MAY ACCEPT THE OFFER OF COMPROMISE IF (1) THE PUBLIC WELFARE AND MORALS WOULD NOT BE IMPAIRED BY ALLOWING THE LICENSEE OR PERMITTEE TO OPERATE DURING THE PERIOD SET FOR THE SUSPENSION AND (2) THE PAYMENT OF THE SUM OF MONEY WILL ACHIEVE THE DESIRED DISCIPLINARY PURPOSES.

(E) THE COMPTROLLER MAY PROMULGATE RULES AND REGULATIONS NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1974.

CHAPTER 51

(House Bill 268)

AN ACT concerning

Calvert County - Barbers

FOR the purpose of requiring barbers in Calvert County to be licensed by the State Board of Barber Examiners and providing that resident barbers of Calvert County may obtain licenses without examination for a specified period of time.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That Section 325A of Article 43 - Health, of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1971 Replacement Volume and 1973 Supplement) be and it is hereby repealed:

Article 43 - Health
