

involved, to any licensed innkeeper or other person engaged in the sale of intoxicating liquors, for the purpose of procuring or having furnished to him, by sale, gift or otherwise, any intoxicating liquors shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof in any court of competent jurisdiction shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than twenty-five dollars (\$25) or imprisoned in jail for a period not exceeding thirty days.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety and having been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, the same shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 73

(House Bill 99)

AN ACT concerning

Abandoned Motor Vehicles

FOR the purpose of altering the definition of an abandoned motor vehicle to include certain other vehicles or parts thereof.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That Section 11-1002.2(g) (2) of Article 66 1/2 - Vehicle Laws, of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1970 Replacement Volume and 1973 Supplement) be and it is hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

Article 66 1/2 - Vehicle Laws
