being by us alone & secretly Examined according to the forme of a certain Act of
Assembly in that case provided) did acknowledge the lands in the within written
Indenture mentioned to be the Right of him the within named Robert Ridgely or
those which the said Robert Ridgely hath of the Gift of them the said Garrat &
Barbara And for them & their heires have Remised & made quite Clayme thereof
to the said Robert & his heires for ever And further they the said Garrat & Barbara
have graunted for them & their heires that the said lands within mentioned unto
him the said Robert & his heires against them the said Garrat & Barbara & their
heires they will waarrant for ever And for this Acknowledgem^t Remise quite Clayme
& Agreeem^t the said Robert hath given them the said Garrat & Barbara Twenty
thousand pounds of tobacco - Taken before us the day & year above said

the 28th day of November 1676.

This Indenture made the Twentieth day of November in the first year of the
Dominion of the Right Honble Charles Absolute Lord & Proprietor of the Provinces
of Maryland & Avalon Lord Baron of Baltimore &c and in the year of our Lord
God 1676. Betweene Alexander Younger of S^t Marys County in the Province
of Maryland gentl^e & Sarah his now wife late the Relict of W^m Law of S^t Marys
County aforesaid deceased of the one part And Charles Boteler of the County of Calvert
gentl^e of the other part Whereas the said W^m Law dyed Seized of a parcell of land
called Dalrys Desire lying on the North side of Sassafras River & held by
Patent from his Lordship the Lord Proprietary bearing date the Twentieth day
of July One thousand six hundred Seventy four and laid out for five hundred
acres more or lesse And whereas also the said W^m Law by his last will and
Testam^t in writing under his hand & Seal bearing date the first day of October
in the year of our Lord One thousand six hundred Seventy & six did give &
bequeath all that tract of land lying at the head of Sassafras River called by
the name of Dalrys Desire unto his loving wife Sarah Law & her heires &
relacon being thereunto had more at large itt doth & may appear Now this
Indenture witnesseth that the said Alexander Younger & Sarah his now wife for
& in consideration of the full sume & just quantity of ten thousand pounds of good
sound & every way well conditioned Merchante tobacco & Cash to them in hand
paid before the enscaling & delivery hereof by the said Charles Boteler well truly
paid & served to be paid the receipt whereof & themselves thereof & thereunto
freely satisfied the said Alexander Younger & Sarah his now wife & either of
them doth hereby clearly & absolutely acquit Release & discharge the said Charles
Boteler his heires &c & Admitt^s & every of them by these & Yents. How
