SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That new Sections 90 through ~~[[102]]~~ 100, inclusive, to be under the new subtitle "Displaced Homemakers" be and they are hereby added to Article 88A - Social Services Administration, of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1969 Replacement Volume and 1975 Supplement) to read as follows:

Article 88A - Social Services Administration  
DISPLACED HOMEMAKERS

THE LEGISLATURE HEREBY FINDS AND DECLARES THAT THERE IS AN EVER-INCREASING NUMBER OF PERSONS IN THIS STATE WHO, HAVING FULFILLED A ROLE AS HOMEMAKER, FIND THEMSELVES "DISPLACED" IN THEIR MIDDLE YEARS THROUGH DIVORCE, DEATH OF SPOUSE, OR OTHER LOSS OF FAMILY INCOME. AS A CONSEQUENCE, DISPLACED HOMEMAKERS ARE VERY OFTEN WITHOUT ANY SOURCE OF INCOME; THEY ARE INELIGIBLE FOR CATEGORICAL WELFARE ASSISTANCE; THEY ARE SUBJECT TO THE HIGHEST UNEMPLOYMENT RATE OF ANY SECTOR OF THE WORK FORCE; THEY FACE CONTINUING DISCRIMINATION IN EMPLOYMENT BECAUSE THEY ARE OLDER AND HAVE NO RECENT PAID WORK EXPERIENCE; THEY ARE INELIGIBLE FOR UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE BECAUSE THEY HAVE BEEN ENGAGED IN UNPAID LABOR IN THE HOME; THEY ARE INELIGIBLE FOR SOCIAL SECURITY BECAUSE THEY ARE TOO YOUNG, AND FOR MANY, THEY WILL NEVER
