

Capital Park and Planning Commission, two members of the Senate of Maryland to be appointed by the President, two members of the House of Delegates of Maryland to be appointed by the Speaker, and six members of the public, three each appointed by the President of the Senate and Speaker of the House of Delegates. One of the public members shall be designated as the Chairman of the Commission jointly by the President and the Speaker. The appointments shall be made before May 1, 1976; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Commission shall study the problems of developing an adequate public facilities program with the cooperation of State and local governments and concerned citizens groups; [[prepare draft legislation necessary to implement Statewide adequate public facilities planning; and report to the General Assembly the proposed legislative and supportive findings no later than November 1, 1976]] consider the feasibility of a statewide program and legislation to implement it if necessary; and report to the General Assembly by November 1, 1976; and be it further

RESOLVED, That each political subdivision of the State is urged to adopt interim [[legislation, pending the Commission Report or the adoption of State and local adequate public facilities legislation,]] plans to restrict subdivision approval where evidence indicates inadequate provision for public facilities; and be it further
