

"(e) State's share to construct a District Court/Multiservice Center Building in [[Centerville]] Centerville contingent upon acquisition of a site which has a frontage of at least 100 feet on: (a) Lawyers Row; (b) North Commerce Street, between projections of the southerly side of Lawyers Row and the northerly side of Broadway; (c) North Liberty Street, between projections of the southerly side of Lawyers Row and the northerly side of Broadway; or (d) Broadway, between North Liberty Street and North Commerce Street.

"(d) Funds provided for the restoration of one-room stone schoolhouse on River Road in Seneca State Park to be designated for a schoolhouse museum and to include parking and restrooms (Montgomery County)..... 35,000"

(5) Item (D) (4) (b) appearing in lines 579 through 583 on page 11 of the bill, entitled

"(b) Funds provided for shore erosion control, for critical State-owned land projects, contingent upon project approval by the Board of Public Works..... 500,000"

(6) Item (M) (1) (d) appearing in lines 1505 through 1527 on page 28 of the bill, entitled

"(d) A grant to the Cecil County Commissioners for stabilization and program development of the Carters Mill Ruin in Cecil County, upon satisfactory assurances to the Board of Public Works that the cost of operating and maintaining the improved property will be guaranteed by the Cecil County Commissioners, contingent on the Carters Mill property being conveyed to said Cecil County Commissioners, and contingent upon said Cecil County Commissioners executing a written contract which provides for a right-of-preservation easement clause.
