

AN ACT concerning City of Baltimore - Industrial Financing Loans. For the purpose of adding a new Article to the Constitution to authorize the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to make, guarantee or insure financial loans for or in connection with the purchase, acquisition, construction, reconstruction, erection, development, redevelopment, rehabilitation, renovation, modernization, or improvement of industrial property in Baltimore City, including any land necessary therefor, and submitting this amendment to the qualified voters of the State of Maryland for their adoption or rejection.

And it is hereby certified that at said election, 362,784 votes were cast for the adoption of said Chapter 553 and 231,408 votes were cast against the adoption of said Chapter 553, the said Chapter 553 of the Acts of 1976 has therefore been ratified by the qualified voters of the State of Maryland.

STATE ADMINISTRATIVE BOARD OF ELECTION LAWS  
ANNAPOLIS, MARYLAND

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 23-11 of Article 33 of the Annotated Code of Maryland, the State Administrative Board of Election Laws does hereby certify that at the General Election held in the State of Maryland on November 2, 1976, an Act known as Chapter 554 of the Acts of 1976 was submitted to the voters of the State of Maryland under the provisions of Article XIV of the Constitution of the State of Maryland, said Act being as follows:

AN ACT concerning Prince George's County - Land Development and Redevelopment PG 90A-76. For the purpose of adding a new article to the Constitution of Maryland to allow Prince George's County to acquire and develop or dispose of certain areas within that county; exercising certain powers of taxation and extending public credit in a certain manner; and submitting this amendment to the qualified voters of the State of Maryland for their adoption or rejection.
