8-502. LEGISLATIVE POLICY.

THE PURPOSE OF THIS SUBTITLE IS TO ASSIST THE NATIONAL RECOVERY AND PROMOTE THE GENERAL WELFARE BY ENABLING THIS STATE AND ITS POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS TO PROVIDE MATCHING FUNDS FOR AND SECURE THE BENEFITS OF ANY FEDERAL FUNDS AVAILABLE UNDER THE FEDERAL ACTS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION AND RECONSTRUCTION OF STATE HIGHWAYS AND COUNTY ROADS AND FOR RELATED STATE OR LOCAL PROJECTS.

8-503. POWER OF ADMINISTRATION AND POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS TO COMPLY WITH FEDERAL ACTS.

(A) LEGISLATIVE ASSENT TO FEDERAL ACTS.

THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND ASSENTS TO THE FEDERAL ACTS.

(B) POWERS IN GENERAL.

THE ADMINISTRATION, FOR ITSELF OR FOR ANY POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THIS STATE, AND EACH POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THIS STATE MAY DO ANYTHING NECESSARY OR DESIRABLE TO COMPLY WITH ANY TERM, CONDITION, OR PROVISION AND TO OBTAIN THE BENEFITS OF ANY OF THE FEDERAL ACTS.

(C) SPECIFIC POWERS OF ADMINISTRATION.

THE ADMINISTRATION MAY:

(1) ACCEPT ANY FEDERAL FUNDS AVAILABLE TO THIS STATE UNDER THE FEDERAL ACTS, FOR THE USE OF THIS STATE OR ANY OF ITS POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS;
