2-407. POWERS AND DUTIES OF COMMITTEE.

THE COMMITTEE SHALL ACT AS THE CENTRAL COORDINATING AGENCY IN THE PLANNING AND EXECUTION OF HIGHWAY SAFETY PROGRAMS. IT DOES NOT HAVE ANY POWER OR DUTY VESTED IN ANY OTHER AGENCY OF STATE GOVERNMENT.

2-408. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF COMMITTEE.

THE DIRECTOR OF THE DIVISION OF TRANSPORTATION SAFETY OF THE DEPARTMENT IS THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE COMMITTEE. THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SERVES AS THE ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER FOR THE COMMITTEE AND IS IN GENERAL CHARGE OF THE WORK OF THE COMMITTEE. THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SHALL DEVELOP, PLAN, AND EXECUTE THE FUNCTIONS AND DUTIES THAT THE COMMITTEE REQUIRES UNDER THIS ARTICLE.
