#### SUBTITLE 6. DRIVING INSTRUCTORS.

##### 15-801. DEFINITIONS.

###### (A) IN GENERAL.

IN THIS SUBTITLE THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS INDICATED.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This subsection is new language used as the standard introductory language to a definition section.

###### (B) DRIVING INSTRUCTOR.

"DRIVING INSTRUCTOR" MEANS ANY INDIVIDUAL WHO:

(1) FOR COMPENSATION, UNDER ANY FORM OF AGREEMENT OR ARRANGEMENT WITH A DRIVERS' SCHOOL, GIVES OR OFFERS TO GIVE INSTRUCTION IN THE DRIVING OF MOTOR VEHICLES; OR

(2) UNLESS HE IS ACTING AS AN EMPLOYEE OF AN EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTION DESCRIBED IN §15-701(B)(2) OF THIS TITLE, OTHERWISE GIVES OR OFFERS TO GIVE ANY OTHER INDIVIDUAL INSTRUCTION IN THE DRIVING OF MOTOR VEHICLES AND RECEIVES OR EXPECTS TO RECEIVE COMPENSATION FOR THAT INSTRUCTION.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This section is new language added to clarify, in conformity with current regulations and practice, the distinction between a drivers' school, which is required to be licensed under Subtitle 7 of this title, and a driving instructor.

Derived in part from the first sentence of present Art. 66 1/2, §6-507(a) and patterned after the definition of "vehicle salesman" in §15-101 of this title, this definition - when read in conjunction with Subtitle 7 and the balance of this subtitle - clarifies the intent that: (i) if, for compensation, an individual instructs others in driving, he first must be licensed as a driving instructor
