(d) Any bus, as defined in Section 11-105 of the Transportation Article; school bus, as defined in Sections 11-173 and 174 of the Transportation Article and taxicab, as defined in Section 11-165 of the Transportation Article (Taxicab shall also include motor vehicles operated with the approval of the Public Service Commission on fixed routes and schedules). Any common carrier vehicle registered with the Interstate Commerce Commission;

(e) Motorcycles as defined in Section 11-136 of the Transportation Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland and mopeds, as defined in Section 11-134.1 of the Transportation Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland;

(f) Trucks as defined in Section 11-171 of the Transportation Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland and bearing a permanent business or commercial identification;

(g) Upon presentation of proper identification and a certificate issued by the Maryland State Police, the Baltimore City Police Department, or a County Police Department, vehicles operated by persons who are required to drive more than 75 miles a day or 400 miles per week (other than for commuting) in their employment or in providing essential medical or social services. Before issuing such a certificate, an authorized police department shall require an affidavit from the applicant and may require pertinent documentary evidence including (a) information relating to motor fuel consumption and (b) business, medical, governmental or social service records or certification showing that issuance of a certificate is warranted under the above standard; hearings on denials of certificates shall be granted, on request, in accordance with Section 12-203 of the Transportation Article and appeals shall lie in accordance with Section 12-209 of the Transportation Article;
