 Ordaine constitute and Appointe you the said George Sumley to be
 Clerk and keeper of the Records of Kent County willing & requiring
 you to take demand and receive and into y^e Custody take all
 Records Transcripts Proceps papers and Enrollments whatsoever
 unto the said County Court belonging or in any wise Appertaining
 And to act do and performe in the said Office of Clerk of
 the said County as fully and amply as any Clerks of a County
 Court may or ought of right to doo, having & taking to your
 owne proper use and behoofe all & singular the perquisites and
 profits to the said Office belonging, rendering therefore a full
 Account of the profits thereof when demanded and paying unto
 the said Sr. Thomas Lawrence Barron. one fourth part of the
 full profits thereof & Anns. so long as you shall continue in the
 said Office to have hold Exercise and enjoy the same and the
 perquisites thereof as aforesaid; during pleasure, Given at the
 Porte of Annapolis under the Seale of My Office this
 Twentififth day of November, in y^e Thirtieth Year of
 the Reigne of King William the Third of England the
 Anneq. Domi 1701
