In subsection (b)(2) of this section, the term "list" is substituted for the archaic term "Registry".

The reference in present Art. 43, § 128(b) to the "Registry" as being "evidence to the same extent as are Land Records" is deleted as obsolete. Art. 35, § 69, which referred to Land Records being used as evidence, was repealed in 1973. However, CJ § 10-204 adequately provides for the use of a public record as evidence.

The attention of the General Assembly is called to the provisions of present Art. 43, § 121(10) -- now subsection (b)(1)(iv) of this section. Present Art. 43, § 121(10) restricts the actions of the Board and Commission to licensed physicians, thus physicians who practice medicine without a license or individuals who are otherwise authorized to practice medicine are not covered by the present law.

#### 14-206. ESTABLISHMENT OF FEES; DISPOSITION OF FUNDS.

##### (A) ESTABLISHMENT OF FEES.

(1) EXCEPT FOR THOSE FEES SPECIFICALLY SET BY THIS TITLE, THE BOARD MAY SET REASONABLE FEES FOR THE ISSUANCE AND RENEWAL OF LICENSES AND ITS OTHER SERVICES.

(2) FUNDS TO COVER THE COMPENSATION AND EXPENSES OF THE COMMISSION MEMBERS SHALL BE GENERATED BY FEES SET UNDER THIS SECTION.

##### (B) DISPOSITION OF FUNDS.

THE BOARD SHALL PAY ALL FUNDS COLLECTED UNDER THIS TITLE INTO THE GENERAL FUND OF THIS STATE.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This section is new language derived without substantive change from Art. 43, §§ 121(13) and 130(f).

Subsection (a)(1) of this section is revised to clarify the authority of the Board - under its broad rulemaking powers - to set reasonable fees for the services for which a fee is not set in the present law. Although present Art. 43, § 121(13) refers only to the establishment of fees for "examinations, reexaminations, registration and reregistration", its provisions should not be read to preclude the Board from imposing fees in other appropriate instances.
