

(III) A RESTAURANT WITH A CLASS BFD LICENSE MUST OPEN FOR BUSINESS NOT LATER THAN 5 P.M. AND COMPLY WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF § 1-102(A)(22)(III) OF THIS ARTICLE.

(IV) THE ANNUAL FEES ARE:

1. \$2,500 FOR A 6-DAY LICENSE, MONDAY THROUGH SATURDAY; AND
2. \$2,900 FOR A 7-DAY LICENSE.

(V) THE LIQUOR CONTROL BOARD SHALL ADOPT RULES TO CARRY OUT THIS SUBSECTION.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 2006.

Dear Mr. Speaker:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, today I have vetoed House Bill 482 – *Harford County – Alcoholic Beverages Licenses – Residency Requirement for Applicants*.

This bill requires applicants for alcoholic beverages licenses in Harford County to be residents for at least 1 year before filing an application.

Senate Bill 656, which was passed by the General Assembly and allowed to go into effect without my signature, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign House Bill 482.
