On motion of Mr. Brown,

Leave was granted the committee on Corporations, to introduce a bill to incorporate the Western Maryland Coal and Oil company;

Also, leave was granted the committee on Corporations, to introduce a bill to incorporate the Grant Coal, Oil and Lumber company of Allegany county.

Mr. Jones, from the committee on Corporations reported favorably a bill entitled, an Act to Incorporate the German Fire Insurance company of Baltimore;

Which was read the first time;

Also, reported favorably a bill entitled, an Act to Incorporate the Locust Point company of the city of Baltimore;

Which was read the first time;

Also, reported favorably a bill entitled, an Act to amend the charter of the Western Maryland Railroad company;

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Anderson, from the committee on the Judiciary, reported favorably a bill entitled, an Act to amend the 5th and 6th sections of the 56th Article of the Code of Public General Laws relating to the licensing of billiard tables.

Mr. Lee, of Baltimore city, from a Select committee reported back to the House a petition from the Judges of the Orphans' Court of Baltimore city, for an increase of compensation, and asked that it be referred to the Judiciary committee;

Which was accepted.

Mr. Robinson, from a Select committee reported favorably a bill entitled, an Act to authorize the County Commissioners of Anne Arundel county to allow the Sheriff of said county additional compensation for boarding prisoners;

Which was read the first time.

The bill entitled, an Act to change the name of Fanny Parker to that of Fanny Parker Roelkey,

Was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
