

On motion of Mr. Anderson,

Ordered, That a committee of three be appointed by the Chair to wait on the Secretary of War and urge a postponement of the draft in Maryland, in order to give the State a reasonable time to fill her quota by volunteering under the provisions of the State Bounty Law;

Also, to request that the Maryland Regiments whose terms of service expire in the Summer and Fall of 1865, be allowed a veteran furlough for the purpose of recruiting and filling up their ranks, provided, their absence from the field would not be prejudicial to the service.

The Speaker appointed Messrs. Anderson, Slothower and Shaw, as the committee.

Mr. Jamison submitted the following amendment:
