

Mr. Hynes presented a memorial from John Milroy and other citizens of Baltimore, against the increase of compensation for the wood corders of the State ;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Inspections.

Mr. Anderson presented a memorial from the Mayor and Council of Hagerstown, asking the General Assembly to authorize the County Commissioners of Washington county to pay a reasonable part of the amount of money, &c., applied to the ransom of the town of Hagerstown in the summer of 1864, in consideration of the county property situated in said town ;

Which was read and referred to the Washington county delegation.

On motion of Mr. Darling,

Ordered, That the application of James E. Davis, to have refunded taxes erroneously paid, be withdrawn from the files of last session and referred to the committee on Claims.

On motion of Mr. Anderson,

Ordered, That hereafter the daily sessions of this House shall be held at 12 o'clock M. and 7½ o'clock P. M. of each day.

On motion of Mr. Lusby,

Leave was granted the committee on Agriculture to report a bill to appropriate the interest to be received from the sale of the scrip donated by the United States to the State of Maryland.

On motion of Mr. Hynes,

Leave was granted the Baltimore city delegation, to report a bill to add to article four of the Code of Public Local Laws of Baltimore city to allow a compensation to the Mayor of Baltimore city as a member of the Board of Police Commissioners.

On motion of Mr. Mules,

Leave was granted the Baltimore city delegation to introduce a bill authorize the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to build a new City Hall.

On motion of Mr. Cook,

Leave was granted the committee on Corporations, to introduce a bill for the charter of the Washington Fire Insurance company of Baltimore.
