Mr. Anderson, from the committee on the Judiciary, also reported favorably the following bills:

A bill entitled, an Act to provide a fixed compensation for all officers of courts that may be appointed under the 10th section, of the 4th Article, of the Constitution.

A bill entitled, an Act to add new sections relating to the division of estates and rights of election, to the 47th Article of the Code of Public General Laws entitled, "inheritance;"

Which were read the first time.

Also, reported favorably, with Senate amendment, the bill entitled, an Act to add a new section to Article 24 of the Code of Public General Laws entitled, Conveyancing; to provide for the execution, acknowledgment and recording of bonds of conveyance and other obligations; to convey real estate, and to make valid such instruments as may have been heretofore executed, acknowledged and recorded;

Which was taken up for consideration on its third reading.
