Whereas, by an Act passed at the present session, the Clerk of the House of Delegates and Secretary of the Senate are required to publish the General Laws passed this session, in every county of the State ; and the Local Laws in such counties as are affected thereby ; and, by an order of the House, the Clerk is required to distribute ten thousand copies of the statement of the resources of Maryland, thereby being detained in the service of the House for a considerable period after the adjournment, therefore,
