

one second lieutenant, one first sergeant, four sergeants, eight corporals, two musicians, one wagoner, and not less than sixty-four, nor more than eighty-two privates.

*Cavalry.*

SECT. 30.—To each regiment of cavalry, there shall be one colonel, one lieutenant colonel, three majors, one surgeon, with the rank of major, two assistant surgeons, with the rank of first lieutenant, one veterinary surgeon, with the rank of sergeant major, one adjutant, one quarter master, one commissary of subsistence, each with the rank of first lieutenant, one chaplain, one sergeant major, one quarter master sergeant, one commissary sergeant, two hospital stewards, one saddler sergeant, one chief trumpeter, and twelve companies or troops.

Each company of cavalry shall consist of one captain, one first lieutenant, one second lieutenant, one first sergeant, one quarter master sergeant, one commissary sergeant, five sergeant, eight corporals, two trumpeters, two farriers, one saddler, one wagoner, and not less than sixty, nor more than seventy-eight privates.

*Artillery.*

SECT. 31.—To each regiment of artillery, there shall be one colonel, one lieutenant colonel, one major to every four companies or batteries, one adjutant, and one quarter master, each with the rank of first lieutenant, one chaplain, one sergeant major, one quarter master sergeant, one commissary sergeant, one hospital steward, and twelve companies or batteries.

To each battery of light artillery, or company of heavy artillery, there shall be one captain, two first lieutenants, two second lieutenants, one first sergeant, one quarter master sergeant, six sergeants, twelve corporals, two buglers, two artificers, one wagoner, and not less than one hundred and fourteen, nor more than one hundred and twenty-two privates.

*Engineers.*

SECT. 32.—To each company of engineers, there shall be one captain, two first lieutenants, one second lieutenant, ten sergeants, ten corporals, sixty-four artificers, and sixty-four privates.

*How Constituted.*

SECT. 33.—Each military district is required to furnish for the National Guard not less than two companies of volunteer infantry. (V. Sect. 210.)
