Depositions taken before me, Samuel Mainster, Justice of the Peace of the State of Maryland :

Be it remembered, I hereby certify that on the 29th day of November, 1864, I, Samuel Mainster, Justice of the Peace, served on Dr. L. Maclin at his residence, a notice in the following words and figures, viz. :

ALBERTON, HOWARD COUNTY, MD.,

*November 29th, 1864.*

DR. LITTLETON MACLIN :

*Sir*:—I would respectfully notify you, that I intend to contest your seat in the Senate of Maryland, before that body, when it meets in January next. I will do so on the evidence that I have collected, which satisfies me that you are not eligible to the office according to the fourth section of the first Article of the New Constitution.

Be it further remembered, that Mr. H. B. Holton applied to me, Samuel Mainster, a Justice of the Peace for the State of Maryland, to take testimony in the above named case, and I issued the following notice, to wit. :

DR. LITTLETON MACLIN :

*Sir*:—You are hereby notified in accordance with the provisions of the 57th section of the 35th Article of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, that an examination of the following witnesses, viz. : Wm. Hollifield, Darius, Grimes, Charles Grimes, David McKenzie, Samuel Espey and Sylvanus Sykes, will take place at my office at Elysville, on Thursday, the 29th day of December, at 11 o'clock A. M.

By those witnesses, Mr. H. B. Holton expects to prove "you are disloyal," and therefore disqualified to hold the office of Senator from Howard county, Maryland.
