Said bill was then sent to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Firey submitted the following resolutions :

Resolved, By the Senate and House of Delegates of Maryland, That whilst we will continue to give to the Administration of President Lincoln, a firm, liberal, and unwavering support, in its efforts to suppress this rebellion, and are ready and willing to exhaust all the resources of the State to sustain the war now waged for the preservation of the Government, and the Union ; yet so soon as the people now in arms against the Government, shall cease all resistance to its rightful authority, and offer to return to their former allegiance, the President of the United States be, and he is hereby requested to suspend hostilities ; when the war ought to cease, and the returning States be admitted into the Union upon their original footing of equality and right.

Resolved, That when the people now in open rebellion
