Amend line 139, by striking out the words “the use of,” and insert, “to be applied to the Tobacco Fund:”

Mr. Duvall proposed the following:

Line 147, after “treasurer,” insert, “for the use of the Tobacco Fund;”

Mr. Magruder proposed the following:

Section 1 (517), lines 166 and 167, strike out the words, “when required to do so by the owner of any tobacco by him inspected;”

Line 167, strike out “samples,” and insert “five bundles;”

Same line, after the word “drawn,” insert “and selected;”

Line 169, strike out the word “samples,” and insert “bundles;”

Line 171, strike out “sample,” and insert “bundle;”

Same line, after the word “together,” insert “as a sample;”

Mr. Duvall proposed the following amendments:

After the word “thereof,” in 363rd line, insert:

“And said returns shall set forth distinctly the number of hogsheads inspected during the quarter, and all the amounts received during that time by said inspector, whether for inspection, cooperage, sales of scrap tobacco, storage, drawing samples, or any other account whatever; showing the amounts
