3-405. DISTRIBUTION.

(A) DIRECTOR OF DEPARTMENT OF LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE.

WITHIN 10 DAYS AFTER THE GOVERNOR DELIVERS AN EXECUTIVE ORDER TO THE SECRETARY OF STATE, THE SECRETARY SHALL DELIVER 2 COPIES OF THE EXECUTIVE ORDER TO THE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE.

(B) ADMINISTRATOR OF DIVISION OF STATE DOCUMENTS.

THE SECRETARY OF STATE SHALL DELIVER 2 CERTIFIED COPIES OF EACH EXECUTIVE ORDER TO THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE DIVISION OF STATE DOCUMENTS.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This section is new language derived without substantive change from former Art. 41, § 256-I(c)(2) and the first sentence of § 15CE(a).

In subsection (a) of this section, the clause "after the Governor delivers an executive order" is substituted for the former reference to "following the receipt of each executive order issued ... under ... § 15CC(a)," since the referenced former provision provided for delivery, rather than issuance. 3-406. PUBLICATION IN CODE.

(A) DELIVERY TO PUBLISHER.

THE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE SHALL DELIVER TO THE PUBLISHER OF THE CODE OF PUBLIC GENERAL LAWS 1 COPY OF EACH EXECUTIVE ORDER THAT IS DELIVERED TO THE DIRECTOR UNDER THIS SUBTITLE.

(B) PUBLICATION; EXCEPTIONS.

THE PUBLISHER SHALL:

(1) CODIFY EACH EXECUTIVE ORDER THAT IS ISSUED IN STATUTORY FORM UNDER ARTICLE II, § 24 OF THE MARYLAND CONSTITUTION, AS STATUTES ARE CODIFIED; AND

(2) AS TO OTHER EXECUTIVE ORDERS THAT ARE REQUIRED TO BE PUBLISHED:

(1) TO THE EXTENT POSSIBLE, ARRANGE EACH OF THESE EXECUTIVE ORDERS BY THE ARTICLE OF THE CODE TO WHICH THE EXECUTIVE ORDER RELATES; AND
