

(b) [Whenever] SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF SUBSECTION (D) OF THIS SECTION, WHENEVER conditions permit, the driver of every truck [and the driver of every motor vehicle towing another vehicle], while traveling on a roadway outside of a business district or a residential district and following any other truck or any other motor vehicle towing another vehicle, shall leave enough space so that an overtaking vehicle may enter and occupy the space without danger.

(C) SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF SUBSECTION (D) OF THIS SECTION, WHENEVER CONDITIONS PERMIT, THE DRIVER OF EVERY MOTOR VEHICLE TOWING ANOTHER VEHICLE, WHILE TRAVELING ON A ROADWAY OUTSIDE OF A BUSINESS DISTRICT OR A RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT AND FOLLOWING ANY OTHER TRUCK OR ANY OTHER MOTOR VEHICLE TOWING ANOTHER VEHICLE, SHALL LEAVE ENOUGH SPACE SO THAT AN OVERTAKING VEHICLE MAY ENTER AND OCCUPY THE SPACE WITHOUT DANGER.

(D) A truck or a motor vehicle towing another vehicle may overtake and pass any other vehicle or combination of vehicles.

[(c)] (E) (1) This subsection does not apply to a funeral procession.

(2) A motor vehicle being driven on a roadway outside of a business district or a residential district in a caravan or motorcade, whether or not towing another vehicle, shall be driven to allow enough space between each two vehicles or combination of vehicles so that any other vehicle may enter and occupy the space without danger.

21-312.

(A) A person may not drive a vehicle onto [or from] any controlled access highway except at the entrances and exits established by public authority.

(B) A PERSON MAY NOT DRIVE A VEHICLE FROM ANY CONTROLLED ACCESS HIGHWAY EXCEPT AT THE ENTRANCES AND EXITS ESTABLISHED BY PUBLIC AUTHORITY.

21-404.

(a) The driver of a vehicle about to enter or cross a highway from a private road or driveway or from any other place that is not a highway shall[:

(1) Stop; and] STOP.

[(2) Yield] (B) THE DRIVER OF A VEHICLE ABOUT TO ENTER OR CROSS A HIGHWAY FROM A PRIVATE ROAD OR DRIVEWAY OR FROM ANY OTHER PLACE THAT IS NOT A HIGHWAY SHALL YIELD the right-of-way to any other vehicle approaching on the highway.
