Dear Mr. President:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 841.

This bill repeals the requirement that the Chief of Police in Baltimore County issue carnival, bazaar, and raffle permits to bona fide volunteer fire, religious, fraternal, civic, veterans, athletic, and charitable organizations in that county.

Senate Bill 623, an emergency bill, was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on April 29, 1986. Senate Bill 623 made changes in the law identical to Senate Bill 841, as well as altering the definition of the types of civic organizations which may conduct certain gaming activities in Baltimore County. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 841.

Senate Bill No. 841

AN ACT concerning

Baltimore County - Carnival, Bazaar, or Raffle Permits

FOR the purpose of repealing the requirement that the chief of police of Baltimore County issue a carnival, bazaar, or raffle permit to certain organizations for use in that county; repealing certain regulations concerning the issuance and the retaining of that permit for public record; and generally relating to carnival, bazaar, or raffle permits in Baltimore County.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

Article 27 - Crimes and Punishments
Section 255(f)(3)
Annotated Code of Maryland
(1982 Replacement Volume and 1985 Supplement)

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
