RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the State of Maryland requests the United States Secretary of Transportation to adopt the necessary regulations that require a yearly check of the traffic violation records of those who operate passenger trains and buses on the rails and highways of the United States, and to establish sufficient standards stating the conditions when an operator's license to drive a train or a bus shall be suspended; and be it further
