

the buying and selling of said tickets, or who aids or abets in the buying and selling thereof within the State of Maryland shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon [a] conviction thereof, fined not more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) or sentenced to not more than six months imprisonment, or both. Each act of buying or selling as aforesaid shall be deemed a separate offense. The State's Attorney of the county or the City of Baltimore, in which a violation of the section may occur, shall initiate prosecutions hereunder and shall be charged with the duty of enforcing this section.
