

Class 7 micro-brewery license may be issued; deleting Allegany County from those jurisdictions in which a pub-brewery license may be issued; clarifying that a certain Class B license may only be only used in a restaurant and not in conjunction with a hotel or motel; clarifying language and structure; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages in Allegany County.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages

5.

(g) (1) A Class 6 pub-brewery license shall be issued:

(i) By the State Comptroller; [and]

(ii) Only to a holder of a Class B beer, wine and liquor (on-sale) license that is issued for use on the premises of a restaurant located in Anne Arundel County, the City of Annapolis, Baltimore City, Frederick County, Harford County, Washington County, Worcester County, or the City of Gaithersburg in Montgomery County; AND

(iii) Only in the following jurisdictions:

1. [Allegany County;

2.] Anne Arundel County;

[3.] 2. Anne Arundel County - City of Annapolis;

[4.] 3. Baltimore City;

[5.] 4. Cecil County;

[6.] 5. Frederick County;

[7.] 6. Harford County;

[8.] 7. Montgomery County - City of Gaithersburg;

[9.] 8. Washington County; and

[10.] 9. Worcester County.
