To all whom it may concern: Be it known that I, Emily Hunt, of Dorchester County in the State of Maryland, for divers good causes and considerations, me therunto moving, as also in further consideration of the sum of Five dollars, current money, to me in hand paid, have released from ^{and by these presents do hereby release from slavery, manumitted & set free.} slavery, liberated, manumitted & set free, Negro Woman, aged twenty five years the first of January next, named Harriet, to be free when she attains the age of thirty five years, and her child Betty or Elizabeth, aged two years on the first of January next, to be free at the age of thirty one years - And also Negro Girl Mahala, aged eight years on the first day of January next, to be free when she attains the age of thirty five years - And I do declare the said Negroes, after the expiration of the said terms of service, ~~shall~~ thenceforth be free, manumitted & discharged from all manner of servitude or service to me my executors or Administrators forever.

Handy of the Town of Cambridge in Dorchester County & State of Maryland, have granted, bargained & sold, and by these presents do grant, bargain & sell unto the said Thomas H. Handy, his heirs and assigns, the following Negroes, To wit: Negro Woman Harriet, aged twenty five years
