(House Bill 1387)

AN ACT concerning

Maryland Historical Trust – Private Property Rights

FOR the purpose of providing that certain statutory provisions may not be construed to limit or prohibit the use of privately owned land by ~~its owner, or a~~ guest of the owner of the land, or to require the ~~owner or~~ guest to obtain certain permits; ~~exempting certain property; correcting a certain reference;~~ and generally relating to the application of the law governing the Maryland Historical Trust to certain private property.
