GBR Scientific, Inc., named for the three primary scientists associated with the Institute of Human Virology, has been established to commercialize technology developed by the institute. The business plan should clearly outline the investment being made by these scientists and other investors, <b>including the City of Baltimore</b>. In addition, the business plan should acknowledge the State's investment of <del>\$15,500,000</del> <b>\$17,000,000</b> in the institute, through fiscal 2000, and provide the State with an equity position in the company at a level that will allow Maryland to recoup its investment.
