

(6) TO HOLD HEARINGS, ADMINISTER OATHS, EXAMINE ANY PERSON UNDER OATH, AND ISSUE SUBPOENAS REQUIRING THE ATTENDANCE AND TESTIMONY OF WITNESSES OR REQUIRING THE PRODUCTION OF DOCUMENTS OR OTHER EVIDENCE;

(7) TO TAKE OR CAUSE TO BE TAKEN AFFIDAVITS OR DEPOSITIONS WITHIN OR OUTSIDE THE STATE; AND

(8) TO SUBMIT EACH YEAR TO THE GOVERNOR, TO THE SECRETARY, AND, SUBJECT TO § 2-1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY A WRITTEN REPORT OF THE ACTIVITIES OF THE BOARD.

(B) EMPLOYEES.

EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED BY LAW, AN EMPLOYEE OF THE BOARD IS SUBJECT TO THE STATE PERSONNEL AND PENSIONS ARTICLE.

(C) DELEGATION OF HEARING POWERS; APPLICATION OF MARYLAND RULES TO SUBPOENAS.

(1) THE BOARD MAY DELEGATE TO A MEMBER OR EMPLOYEE OF THE BOARD ITS POWERS UNDER THIS SECTION TO HOLD HEARINGS, ADMINISTER OATHS, EXAMINE A PERSON UNDER OATH, AND ISSUE SUBPOENAS.

(2) A SUBPOENA ISSUED UNDER THIS SECTION IS SUBJECT TO THE MARYLAND RULES.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This section is new language derived without substantive change from former Art. 27, § 818.

In subsections (a)(6) and (c) of this section, the term "subpoena[s]" is substituted for the former term "summons" to reflect the appropriate use of those terms under the Maryland Rules.

In subsections (a)(6) and (c)(1) of this section, the former references to "affirmation[s]" are deleted in light of the term "oath", which includes affirmation. See Art. 1, § 9.

In subsection (a) of this section, the former references to "rules" are deleted in light of the term "regulations". See General Revisor's Note to article.

Also in subsection (a) of this section, the former requirement that rules be "suitable" is deleted as implicit in Title 10, Subtitle 1 of the State Government Article, which requires that regulations be adopted according to a procedure designed to ensure suitability. See, e.g., SG § 10-111.1(b).

In subsection (a)(3)(i) of this section, the defined term "delinquent act" is added. See General Revisor's Note to title.
