SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That Section(s) 2-201 and 2-202 of Article 20 – Somerset County of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland be repealed.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 20 – Somerset County

2-201.

(A) THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS SHALL APPOINT A CLERK ON THE FIRST DAY THAT THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS' TERM OF OFFICE BEGINS.

(B) THE TERM OF THE CLERK IS 4 YEARS AND SHALL RUN CONCURRENTLY WITH THE TERM OF OFFICE OF THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS.

(C) IF THE OFFICE OF THE CLERK BECOMES VACANT BECAUSE OF THE DEATH, RESIGNATION, INCOMPETENCY, OR OTHER DISQUALIFICATION OF THE CLERK FOR THE OFFICE, THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS SHALL FILL THE VACANCY FOR THE PERIOD OF THE UNEXPIRED TERM.

(D) THE CLERK SHALL RECEIVE AN ANNUAL SALARY AS SET BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS.
