





Stewart  Be it remembered unto it is hereby certified that the following Bill of Sale was received and recorded on the 30th day of July 1852 to wit: Thomas Willis  Know all men by these presents that I Thomas Willis of Dorchester County in the State of Maryland for and in consideration of the sum of Three hundred and Twelve dollars and fifty cents to me in hand paid by James A. Stewart of said County and State have granted bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said James A. Stewart all my right title claim and interests of me and my negro woman Harriet, acquired under and by virtue of a Bill of Sale of the same to me from John Mills & Eliza Brooks dated the 13th day of June 1850 and recorded in Liber W. S. No. 3 folio 359 one of the Chattel record books of Dorchester County. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 24th day of July 1852
