Joseph Weatherly Know all men by these presents that Joseph Weatherly of Dorchester County and state of Maryland, for and in consideration of the sum of Five thousand dollars Current money of Maryland to me in hand paid by Samuel R. Dunnocke of the same County and state aforesaid, at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, and I the said Joseph Weatherly have bargained and sold, conveyed and transferred, unto the said Samuel R. Dunnocke his heirs and assigns forever, the following negroes to wit -

One negro man David, one ditto Spencer, one ditto James, one ditto Gabriel, and ditto James, one negro boy James, and ditto William, one ditto Moses, one ditto Jacob one ditto Stephen; one negro woman Rachel, one ditto Sarah, and child Jane, one ditto Rachel, one ditto Mary, Slaves for life, and sound in body and in mind.

To Have and To Hold the said above named negroes unto the said Samuel, Dunnocke his heirs & assigns forever, to his and their sole use and use forever, and to and for no other use intent or purpose whatsoever, against me the said Joseph Weatherly and my heirs, and against all persons whatsoever, shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents.
