Andrews, his executors, administrators and assigns, all the following named goods, chattels, that is to say, one bay mare, two hells, one ox, two carts, and fourteen sheep, all and singular, which said goods and chattels are now remaining and being on a certain messuage or tenement, situate on the upper or northeast end of an Island called Elliotts Island, in the aforesaid County, and now in the occupation of the said Thomas Bestpiche: I have and do hold, all and singular the said goods and Chattels, and other the premises above bargained and sold, or mentioned and intended to be to the said John R. Andrews, his administrators, Executors, and assigns, forever, and I the said Thomas Bestpiche, for my self my heirs, executors and administrators, all and singular the said goods and chattels and other the premises unto the said John R.
