17-325.

All agreements to pay compensation to recover or assist in the recovery of property made within 24 months of the date the property is paid or delivered to the abandoned property [division] OFFICE are unenforceable [unless the compensation to be paid is 20 percent or less of the property to be recovered].

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1991.

(Senate Bill 54)

AN ACT concerning

Child Support Enforcement – Parents' Social Security Numbers

FOR the purpose of requiring ~~parents to provide their social security numbers on certain birth certificate forms;~~ each parent of a child to provide his or her own social security number on a certain birth certificate form; requiring a father, under certain circumstances, to provide his social security number on a certain form; providing for the disclosure of certain information to the Child Support Enforcement Administration; specifying the uses the Child Support Enforcement Administration may make of the social security numbers of parents; requiring a court to order a father to provide his social security number to the clerk of court upon an adjudication of paternity; requiring a clerk of court to send to the Secretary of the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, the social security number of a father following an adjudication of paternity; establishing a penalty for a violation of this Act; making this Act an emergency measure; and generally relating to information obtained at the time of birth.
