

(2) [A] EXCEPT ON INTERSTATE HIGHWAYS, A single unit vehicle with 3 axles, or a combination of vehicles with a trailer less than 32 feet long, either registered as a farm vehicle or carrying agricultural products, is permitted an axle load limit tolerance of 5 percent from § 24-109(b) and (c) of this subtitle, except during harvest time when a tolerance of 15 percent from § 24-109(b) and (c) of this subtitle is permitted for a vehicle carrying the following agricultural products:

- (i) Wheat, for the period from June 1 to August 15;
- (ii) Corn, for the period from July 1 to December 1; and
- (iii) Soybeans, for the period from September 1 to December 1.

(3) Except on interstate highways, a single unit vehicle with at least 3 axles or a combination of vehicles with a trailer length of less than 32 feet or a semitrailer length of 45 feet or less carrying forest products that have been loaded in forests or other similar off-highway locations is permitted an axle load limit tolerance of 5 percent from § 24-109(b) and (c) of this subtitle.

(i) (1) Except as provided for in paragraph (2) of this subsection regulations adopted under this section for intrastate motor carrier transportation may not:

- (i) Require that a driver be older than 18 years of age; ~~OR~~
- (ii) Apply the provisions of § 391.21, § 391.23, § 391.31 or § 391.35 of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations to:

1. A driver who is a regularly employed driver of a motor carrier for a continuous period that began before July 1, 1986, if the driver continues to be a regularly employed driver of the motor carrier; or

2. The motor carrier, with regard to a driver described under Item 1. of this subparagraph, if the motor carrier continues to employ the {driver;} ~~DRIVER.~~

{(iii) Before January 1, 1987, apply the provisions of Part 391 of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations;

(iv) Limit a driver's time or hours on duty or require a driver to maintain a record of duty status if:

1. The driver operates only within a 100 air mile radius of the driver's normal work reporting location; and

2. The driver returns to the driver's normal reporting location and is released from work within a period of 15 consecutive hours;
