STATE ADMINISTRATIVE BOARD OF ELECTION LAWS

ANNAPOLIS, MARYLAND

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 23-11 of Article 33 of the Annotated Code of Maryland, the State Administrative Board of Election Laws does hereby certify that at the General Election held in the State of Maryland on November 6, 1990, an Act known as Chapter 61 of the Acts of 1990 was submitted to the voters of the State of Maryland under the provisions of Article XIV of the Constitution of the State of Maryland, said Act being as follows:

AN ACT concerning

Prohibition Against Holding More Than One Office - Exception

For the purpose of creating an exception to the constitutional prohibition against certain executive, legislative, and judicial branch personnel holding more than one office of profit or trust to allow them to be members of reserve components of the armed forces of the United States or members of the militia of the United States or this State; and submitting this amendment to the qualified voters of the State of Maryland for their adoption or rejection.

And it is hereby certified that at said election, 547,530 votes were cast for the adoption of said Chapter 61 and 274,255 votes were cast against the adoption of the said Chapter 61, the said Chapter 61 of the Acts of 1990 has therefore been ratified.
