Emergency Bill No. 1-90

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact with amendments, Sections 6-8(b), 6-9(preface), 6-11(3), 6-33(preface) of Article III of Chapter 6 of the Public Local Laws of Kent County, Maryland, entitled Grading and Sediment Control, changing references to the Annotated Code of Maryland and changing the reference to "Department of Natural Resources" to "Department of the Environment" throughout.

Passed February 6, 1990.

Emergency Bill No. 2-90

AN ACT to add new Article XI to Chapter 5, Code of Public Local Laws of Kent County, (1984 Edition, being Article 15 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland), title "Kent County", sub-title "Health and Safety", to follow immediately after Section 5-93 thereof, to provide for the control of the construction, alteration, addition, removal demolition, use, location, occupancy and maintenance of all buildings and structures; adoption of the BOCA Basic Building Code (1987, 10th Edition), the One and Two Family Dwelling Code (1989 Edition, 1st printing), and the BOCA Basic Energy Conservation Code (1987, 5th Edition), as adopted by the Building Officials and Code Administrators International, Inc.

Passed Date March 6, 1990.

Emergency Bill No. 3-90

AN ACT to legalize the 1989 Supplements to the Code of Public Local Laws of Kent County published under the direction of the Board of County Commissioners of Kent County and making provision for the publication, sale and distribution of this Code.

Passed April 3, 1990.

Emergency Bill No. 4-90

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact with an amendment Section 1-9(a) of Article I of Chapter I of the Public Local Laws of Kent County, Maryland, entitled Flag and Seal, by adding the great seal of Kent County to the official flag of Kent County.

Passed May 1, 1990.

Emergency Bill No. 5-90

AN ACT to add new Section 5-28(e) to Article II, of Chapter 5, Code of Public Local Laws of Kent County (1984 Edition, being Article 15 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland) title "Kent County", sub-title "Health and Safety" to follow immediately after Section 5-28(d) thereof and to repeal and re-enact with amendments
