CHAPTER 23

(Senate Bill 267)

AN ACT concerning

Annual Curative Bill

FOR the purpose of generally curing previous Acts of the General Assembly enacted with possible title or other defects; authorizing the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission to issue certain administrative orders for certain violations of the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission Pretreatment Program; requiring the Maryland State Police to collect and analyze information relating to incidents apparently directed against an individual or group because of the individual's or group's race, religion, ethnicity, or sexual orientation; requiring local law enforcement agencies and the State Fire Marshal to provide the State Police with certain information; repealing a requirement that the State comprehensive mental health plan set standards for providing certain services; prohibiting a person from carelessly or negligently shooting, wounding, or killing another person or intentionally or willfully destroying or damaging certain property or livestock, while engaged in hunting or pursuing wildlife; authorizing the suspension of a person's hunting license for a certain period of time for violation of certain hunting statutes or regulations; authorizing Howard County, by ordinance enacted from time to time by the County Council, to fix, impose, and collect development impact fees for financing, in whole or in part, the capital costs of additional or expanded public works, improvements, and facilities required to accommodate new construction or development; generally relating to the fixing, imposing, and collecting of development impact fees in Howard County; amending Chapter 568 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1990 to include as a use for the grant to The Benedictine School for Exceptional Children, Inc. the expansion and equipping of the existing facilities, including the administration wing of the school, which includes classrooms and dormitories; providing for the effect and construction of certain provisions of this Act; making this Act an emergency measure; and generally repealing and reenacting without amendments certain Acts of the General Assembly that may be subject to possible title or function paragraph or other defects, in order to validate those Acts.
