

(i) The Administration and the Maryland State Police shall establish prevention and education programs to encourage compliance with the provisions of this section.

(j) The Administration shall include information on this State's experience with the provisions of this section in the annual evaluation report on the State's highway safety plan that this State submits to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration and the Federal Highway Administration under 23 U.S.C. § 402.

(k) (1) A police officer may enforce the provisions of this section only as a secondary action when the police officer detains a driver of a motor vehicle for a suspected violation of another provision of the Code.

(2) NOTHING CONTAINED IN ~~THIS~~ PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION MAY BE CONSTRUED TO LIMIT THE ENFORCEMENT OF A VIOLATION UNDER § 22-412.2 OF THIS SUBTITLE ~~AS A SECONDARY ACTION.~~

**CHAPTER 281**

**(House Bill 38)**

AN ACT concerning

**District Court – Appearance of Attorney – Exceptions**

FOR the purpose of expanding the exceptions to certain requirements for the practice of law to permit certain employees of a corporation or sole proprietorship and certain partners and employees of certain partnerships to represent the corporation, sole proprietorship, or partnership in certain civil actions in the District Court; and generally relating to certain exceptions pertaining to the appearance of attorneys in the District Court of Maryland.
